Course Description: Students will read YA novels, picture books, poetry, and discuss issues such as censorship, YA film, graphic novels, the verse novel, and more.

ENG 512 or EDU 512 Teaching Writing with Technology ENG/EDU 51201 (3 credits)

Meeting Dates: Tuesdays, 5:00-6:20 PM, January 15—May 7

This blended course has some class time online and some on campus in Murphy Hall 106, MWSU

Course Description: What does it mean to teach writing effectively in a digital age? In this workshop-style course, we will 1) explore digital literacy in its many evolving forms, including audio, video, web texts, social media, and media-enhanced presentations; 2) discuss the ways that technology has changed the way we teach writing, the way writers compose, and the ways audiences read digital texts; 3) design technology-based lessons to use in our classrooms.
